THE LAW SOCIETY OF ALBERTA ADDRESSES INACCURACIES IN CBC NEWS REPORT

The Law Society of Alberta takes issue with several statements in a CBC News report aired and published March 12, 2013, regarding Mr. Arthur Kent and his dealings with our organization.

The Law Society's concerns relate to statements he made about political influence on our complaints process, the provision of information about complaints under review, potential conflict of interest in Conduct Committee Panel members and the length of time involved in the complaints process.

The Law Society takes its responsibility to serve the public interest very seriously and is disappointed by these comments.
